These days, when it comes to Christmas heroes, it's a red nosed reindeer that grabs the limelight and, in fairness, the reindeer, and in particular Rudolph, do have a claim to fame and a good story to tell. Despite being ridiculed for the colour of his nose it's Rudolph's glowing hooter that comes to the rescue when a foggy night threatened to ground Santa and disrupt his delivery schedule.

But while the reindeer might hog the Christmas headlines it's we donkeys who have the more amazing tale to tell.

It's a long trek from Nazareth to Bethlem and, with a precious burden on my back, I had to tread carefully. It seemed that everyone was on the move and, with the inns full, there was little choice but to spend each night in the open, sleeping under the stars, huddled together for warmth. While the man occasionally slipped from under his blanket to stir the fire back to life, it was me who guarded the family, sniffing the air and pricking up my ears to sense the approach of any danger.

When we finally reached Bethlehem, we were all exhausted and, with no room in the inn, we all ended up in the stable for the night – and what a night it was.

At first, the silence of the dark night was broken only by the comforting sound of hay being munched and an occasional satisfied snort and grunt and so, we were soon asleep. But then, the woman cried out in pain and there was pandemonium. Lamps were hurriedly lit, people came running and for a couple of hours the stable was full of screams of pain and anxious chatter until a final gasp and a baby's cry brought smiles to faces.

They called the baby Jesus and, after everyone left, they laid him in my manger, for me to keep an eye on, while he and they slept.

I was probably the only one to have heard the sound of distant singing, but then some shepherds arrived shouting about singing angels and the peace of the night was shattered for a second time. As the baby grew into a boy, he and I become good friends. I loved him and he me.

But that's not the end of the story. Many years later, I and my colt were standing in the sun tethered to a ring when some men arrived and untied us both. "Our master needs them," they said when challenged.

You can imagine how amazed I was to be reunited with my friend Jesus and how proud to be with him as he rode my colt into Jerusalem surrounded by an adoring crowd. But the jubilation didn't last and a few days later he was executed by the Romans. They say, although he never did wrong, he died as a punishment for all the wrong we have done and as a result he is able to offer a fresh start and a clear conscience to anyone who is willing to reach out and receive his gift of forgiveness.

So, as we ponder the wonder of God's intervention in human history and celebrate the arrival of his son Jesus by the giving and receiving of gifts, let's consider the priceless gift that God is offering and reach out to receive it this Christmas.

To Be A Pilgrim

A pilgrimage to North Macedonia & Albania Led by Reverend Alison Newman (former Vicar of St. Mark's Church)

6 - 15 October 2025

Firstly, what is a pilgrim? After the Mayflower arrived in Plymouth, Massachusetts in the 17th century, the firstborn baby boy was called Peregrine(Latin peregrinus). This word which means travelling from faraway, and often describes pilgrims, who visit shrines and holy places.

In 1684, John Bunyan wrote "The Pilgrim's Progress' and a hymn, "He who would valiant be, 'gainst all disaster. Let him in constancy, follow the Master. There's no discouragement shall make him once relent. His first avowed intent to be a pilgrim."

With these words in mind, our intrepid travellers arrived at Heathrow airport at 7.15am for the first leg of the flight to Warsaw, where we would take our second flight to Skopje, Macedonia, 55 minutes later. However, the late arrival of our Warsaw bound flight, meant that we had to scoot for the flight to Skopje, as it departed 20 minutes after our Warsaw arrival.

Suffice it to say, that on arrival in Skopje, that day, our luggage did not join us till nearly 2 days later. We determined to make the most of the situation, despite freezing weather on Day 1 of our itinerary. Skopje was the birthplace & home of the newly canonised Saint Teresa from 1910-28. The Memorial house was built on the site of the church where she was baptised, took communion and sang in the choir. The photo below, is of Mother Teresa, in the serene chapel dedicated to her in Skopje.



We visited many monasteries, including St. George's. it is noteworthy because of its many frescoes, and its architecture.



A particular highlight was 3 course meal in Bitola. Of course, each dish was accompanied with tastes of 3 appropriate wines. We dined like Royalty.

From Macedonia to Albania. Our first magnificent hotel overlooked the 3 million years old Lake Ohrid, Here we visited the ancient theatre, and Tsar Samuel's fortress.

Ohrid is a UNESCO World heritage site, nicknamed 'the Jerusalem of the Balkans'.





BLACK GOLD IN THE GARDEN

As leaves tumble to the ground, they create a mosaic of colours across the green lawn, jostling gently in the lightest of breezes. Yet, as the wicked wind plays its games, no sooner have you

gathered the leaves into neat piles for the green waste bin than you turn around to find the lawn covered once again. The endless chase with falling leaves continues until Christmas, perhaps beyond, as new ones arrive, blown in from neighbouring gardens, streets, and trees yet to shed their canopy.



Despite this seasonal frustration, leaves are a vital gift to the garden, a key link between trees, soil, and the ecosystem below. They improve soil structure, protect vulnerable roots, and feed the ground with organic matter as they decompose.



Mulching is a word often heard at this time of year. Applying a 5–10 cm layer of mulch in early spring improves both drainage and water retention. It encourages worm activity, which draws the compost deeper into the soil, enriching roots below. This process improves soil structure, increases oxygen flow, and prevents compaction, helping plants breathe and take in moisture more easily.

The health and vigour of plants can be greatly improved through annual mulching with materials that decompose, feed the soil, and stimulate biological activity.

Falling leaves are ideal for this, free, abundant, and effective. Rather than buying mulch from a garden centre, gather leaves and store them in compost bins or black bags with holes for drainage. If you have garden borders, leaves can also be placed directly onto the soil to rot down naturally in place.



If space allows, having two large compost bins made from pallets is ideal. You can fill one with fresh weeds, leaves, spent annuals, kitchen peelings, and mowings, while the other is left to decompose, ready for use in spring. Diseased plants or invasive species such as couch grass and mare's-tail, however, should

go into your green waste collection instead.

Turn your compost once or twice over autumn with a fork to let in air and moisture—this encourages heat and speeds decomposition. Alternatively, move the contents from one bin to the other when space allows.

You'll be amazed how much rich compost, sometimes called "Black Gold" can be produced simply by recycling garden waste. Throughout my working life in parks and gardens, I've promoted the use of mulch, spreading well-rotted compost over borders as both gardener and manager. Doing so in my own garden each year has been invaluable,



especially this summer when mulching reduced the need for hose watering.

Over the years, I've come to appreciate just how essential mulching has become as our climate grows increasingly erratic, with longer, drier summers. I like to apply mulch in late winter, just as the spring bulbs begin to break through the soil, any later, and it's nearly impossible to spread it without disturbing their tender growth. It's also remarkable how much easier weeding becomes as the soil turns friable and loose; on a dry, sunny

spring day, a quick pass with the hoe keeps the garden borders beautifully managed.

Take a note in your 2026 diary, to get you started in the allotment or in the garden, the Biggin Hill and District Horticultural Society first talk of the year is on Wednesday 18th March, "The Modern Kitchen Garden" by Barry Newman.
